Have you noticed how easy it is to become preoccupied with so many good things-programs, conferences, meetings, sporting events, - that people get pushed to peripheral.

All of us, especially the church as an organization, have to fight this natural drift toward maintenance, to say focused on our mission. It is too easy as an organization to focus our time and energy on maintaining the organization so that it exists only for itself but leaves no energy for mission. We lose sight of lost people and then make excuses for it. Jesus never let maintenance overshadow the mission. Jesus came to seek and save the lost.

We must never lose sight of lost people. Jesus states that his mission was, and still is, to seek and save lost. That was central to his life and it is still central to the life of his church. Otherwise we end up existing just for ourselves. He never lost sight of investing in and inviting people into his community of disciples. He did not allow himself to become so preoccupied with his group that he neglected his mission. Those labeled as the worst of sinners were drawn to his message of extravagant grace.


Jesus had set his face toward Jerusalem, determined to fulfill his purpose (9:51). On his way, Luke 19 says he passes through Jericho and it is there that he runs into Zacchaeus. In the minds of the Pharisees and the Scribes, Zacchaeus was a worthless person who deserved to be burned alive. Zacchaeus was a Jew who purchased the right from Rome to raise funds for an oppressive occupying army that was responsible for the brutal death of hundreds of thousands of people. He was considered a traitor, despised by his fellow Jews. But he is drawn near to Jesus. He is not the only one, all kinds of sinners are drawn to Jesus too.

"Sinner" was marked as a class of people who are deformed, diseased or whose job is one that the Jews considered beyond redemption. They were the prostitutes, strippers, slave traders, tax collectors or they had some kind of physical ailment that the Jews viewed as a curse from God. Yet those least like Jesus liked Jesus.

'They' grumbled because Gods' grace and mercy was being extended to a tax collector. Those who saw themselves as most like Jesus were least like Jesus and did not like Jesus. Jesus came to seek and save the lost; the least like Jesus, liked Jesus.

Which group do you identify with? Are you like the Pharisees and see yourselves morally superior to 'sinners?' Or are you like Zacchaeus who sees your need for Jesus' extravagant grace? Who is in the sycamore tree in your life? Let me encourage you to choose one person or family and invest in them this year and as God opens the door invite them to something.

Pray for divine appointments daily for the next fourteen days and see what God does. Pray for these people every day. Imagine Lamar Avenue being a people that are so overwhelmed with God's extravagant grace that we want to share that grace with others? Imagine us being so transformed by God's extravagant grace that others are climbing sycamore trees to be with us. Imagine all of us investing in one person or family this year and over the course of this year they gave their lives to Christ. Where we would we be? Remember, with God, all things are possible!

"The Last Days"

How old is the earth? Well, science tells us that the earth is millions of years old, but they cannot prove that observation. According to the Bible, the earth is around 6,000 years old. If we look at the genealogy of Jesus in <u>Luke 3:23-38</u>, it explains the Genealogy from Adam

until Jesus. We know that the Bible teaches us about 3 "eras" or dispensations or periods of time. The first one, the Patriarchal Era, is from Adam until Moses and the Law. The next period, known as the Mosaic Era, is from Moses or the law given on Mount Sinai. And the last period of time, known as the "Christian Era", is from the Death of Jesus in the Cross until the Second Coming of Christ in Glory in His Second Coming.

Since we are in the last era, we can say that we are in the last days. How long is this era going to be? We don't know....but we need to understand that God's time isn't like our time. To Him, one day could be 1000 days, or 1000 days could be like one day. The Apostle Peter says that in 2 Peter 3:8 But do not forget this one thing, dear friends: With the Lord a day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like a day. In verses 9-12 Peter says that the Lord will come. 9 The Lord is not slow in keeping his promise, as some understand slowness. Instead he is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance. 10 But the day of the Lord will come like a thief. The heavens will disappear with a roar; the elements will be destroyed by fire, and the earth and everything done in it will be laid bare. 11 Since everything will be destroyed in this way, what kind of people ought you to be? You ought to live holy and godly lives.

Sometimes we call this "the end of the world", "the last days", or "the second coming" and we tend to be afraid of this topic. But we don't need to be afraid. We need to get ready, prepare every day of our life. Every Sunday when we take the Lord Supper we are announcing to the world that our Lord is Coming <u>1 Corinthians</u> 11:26 For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

Let's do our best every day of our lives because this could be our last day, <u>Romans 13:11</u> And do this, understanding the present time: The hour has already come for you to wake up from your slumber, because our salvation is nearer now than when we first believed. <u>1 John 2:28-29. 28</u> And now, dear children, continue in him, so that when he appears we may be confident and unashamed before him at his coming. 29 If you know that he is righteous, you know that everyone who does what is right has been born of him.
