How many were there? We don't know. Where did they come from? We don't know. How long did the journey take? We don't know.



The wise men were told to take a different route. They were told that they could not go back the same way that they came. I find that to be a fact today as well. Once you have met God it changes everything. You aren't the same. You can't travel the same way you did before.

- * Jacob wrestled with God and God touched him and Jacob never walked the same the rest of his life.
- * Isaiah stepped into God's presence and immediately said, "Woe is me, I am undone! Because I am a man of unclean lips and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips for my eyes have seen the king." Isaiah was never the same again.
- * Job questioned God over and over trying to figure out why he was suffering so much. Then God shows up and Job says, "I'm speechless-words fail me!" Job 40:4-5. Job met God and he was a changed man. That's what happens when we come into God's presence.

Knowledge is one thing. Wisdom is another. It is one thing to know something. It is quite another thing to believe something to the point that it changes your life. You may have heard this riddle: once there were 3 frogs on a log. One of them decided to jump off. How many are left? Two? Nope. Three. Because he just decided...he never took the plunge. Never took the leap of faith.

Too many of us have said we believe but we never do anything with our faith. Maybe you are one of those who's sitting on the log this morning. Maybe it's time for you to jump in.

"Healing Wounds"

"At that hour of the night the jailer took them and washed their wounds;" (Acts 16:33)

In his second mission trip, the Apostle Paul and Silas went to preach the gospel of Christ in the city of Philippi. Lydia was baptized there. They were

confronted by the opposition, the governors of Philippi, who ordered them to be punished by flogging. Even then, they were singing to God and praying. About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God and the other prisoners were listening to them... (Acts 16:25)

Why do we have spiritual wounds? Could be for two reasons:

- 1. because somebody commits sin against us and that give us a "wound" or
- 2. because we "give wounds" when we commit sin against others".

Sometimes we even don't realize that we are wounding others with our wrong actions like the jailer in Acts 16. This is a very good example of what happens when we commit sin toward others or to ourselves. We wound others with our sins, or we can wound ourselves.

The Bible doesn't mention if the jailer himself executed the punishment to Paul and Silas, but later when he recognized his mistake he did what he was able to do—he washed their wounds. He could not take back the time and take away the wounds, but he could help to heal their wounds. We need to be willing to participate in this process of healing in the spiritual aspect, in our sins and the sins we commit toward others. But the question could be do we want to inflict wounds, or a heal wounds?

The jailor's history is a very good example of how God can change us if we allow him to. In the same hour he obeyed Jesus through baptism.

When the Apostle Paul wrote his letter to the Church in Philippi, he said: For it has been granted to you on behalf of Christ not only to believe on him, but also to suffer for him, since you are going through the same struggle you saw I had, and now hear that I still have.

(Philippians 1:29-30)

To heal a wound takes time is not automatic, is not fast.... Let's try to understand this is a process that requires patience and prayer. We need to be willing to accept healing and we need to be willing to be ready to heal others like Christ healed our sins through his precious blood.
