Do we hear God's Word without allowing it to transform us? That seems to have been Israel's problem from the very beginning. God spoke to them through Moses, and God miraculously delivered them from the Egyptians through the Red Sea.

In Exodus 15:22-24, we see that Moses led Israel from the Red Sea and they went into the Desert of Shur. For three days they traveled in the desert without finding water. When they came to Marah, they could not drink its water because it was bitter. That is why the place is called Marah (which

means bitterness). So the people grumbled against Moses, saying, "What are we to drink?" The bitterness of the water reflected the bitterness in their hearts. They had gone three days without water. They're about to drop; when in the distance they see an oasis. Their parched lips and dry throats can already taste the cool, clear water, but when they finally arrive and bend down for a cool, refreshing drink, they come up spitting out salt water. No wonder they grumbled, but how could they so quickly forget what God did for them just three days earlier?

Exodus 15:25a Then Moses cried out to the Lord, and the Lord showed him a piece of wood. He threw it into the water, and the water became sweet. They may have forgotten God, but God did not forget them. In His grace, He made the water drinkable. Then He gave them a test. In v.25b-26 God promised to keep them from Egyptian diseases if they listen to Him. And we see that God abundantly provides for His people in v.27: Then they came to Elim, where there were twelve springs and seventy palm trees, and they camped there near the water.

As chapter 16 opens, we see that they still didn't get it. There they go again – grumbling! They not only forgot how BAD Egypt was, but also how GOOD God had been to them. It's like it all went in one ear and out the other. But even though they forgot God, God did not forget them. Here's the truth of the matter: When God's people grumble against God's leaders, they grumble against God Himself.

As the story continues, what we see is that they completely disregarded all that God told them to do. It has no transforming effect on their behavior, even though God's command is actually to their benefit. And that's what happens when we grumble. God's Word goes in one ear and out the other, and we can't appreciate all that God says and does for us if we're complaining all the time. So if you want God's Word to make a difference in your life...

DON'T GRUMBLE. Don't murmur and complain. Don't become critical and whine about your circumstances every time they don't match up to your expectations. As the saying goes, there is a better way to live! When life gets hard, don't grumble...GROW!

I will exalt you, my God and King, and praise your name forever and ever. I will praise you every day; yes, I will praise you forever. Great is the Lord! He is most worthy of praise! No one can measure his greatness....

"There were others" Hebrews 11:35-40.

There were others who were tortured, refusing to be released so that they might gain an even better resurrection.

36 Some faced jeers and flogging, and even chains and imprisonment.

37 They were put to death by stoning;

they were sawed in two; they were killed by the sword. They went about in sheepskins and goatskins, destitute, persecuted and mistreated—38 the world was not worthy of them. They wandered in deserts and mountains, living in caves and in holes in the ground. 39 These were all commended for their faith, yet none of them received what had been promised, 40 since God had planned something better for us so that only together with us would they be made perfect.

When we read about the heroes and giants of faith in the Bible, we really enjoy reading in the scripture the passage that told us how little David was able to defeat the giant Goliath, with the help of God. We really enjoy reading how Daniel survived in the Lions den (Daniel 6). God protected him and the lions didn't even scratch Daniel, instead to his enemies, the lions started eating them before they get to the floor (Daniel 6:24). We also enjoy reading about his friends Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego and how they survived the blazing furnace (Daniel 3), even their cloths did not smell like smoke. These are all amazing stories of faith and victory.

But we need to understand that in the life of Christians, God's plan is not that everything it will be perfect, actually our Lord Jesus Christ says that we will suffer persecution (Matthew 5:10-12). Paul repeats that in 2 Timothy 3:12, and is exactly the point the author of Hebrews 11 is trying to address in verses 35 and 36, that there where others, that experience victory in their physical life, actually they died. This is something that we need to understand, yes they died, but they died in Faith. Maybe they did not see any triumph or victory on this earth, but I'm pretty sure that our Lord Jesus Christ has a Crown of Glory for each one of them, Amen.

The Question to ourselves this day is, are we willing to be part of those "others"? I hope we are.

Revelation 3:11-12. 11 I am coming soon. Hold on to what you have, so that no one will take your crown. 12 The one who is victorious I will make a pillar in the temple of my God. Never again will they leave it. I will write on them the name of my God and the name of the city of my God, the new Jerusalem, which is coming down out of heaven from my God; and I will also write on them my new name. Marcelino.
